The PPSAT faculty and staff, TESDA Palawan Provincial Director Vivian Abueva, students, together with the coaches and judges of respective courses, gathered at the Multipurpose Hall to witness the opening program. PPSAT Vocational School Administrator III, Dr. Sianita C. Tadlas conveyed the opening remarks while PD Abueva gave an inspiring message that focused on the holistic development of TVET learners. Before finally starting the competition proper, one competitor in welding, Ramil Villegas, led the Oath of Competitors. All the event participants immediately proceeded to their respective competition venues after attending the opening program.

Specifically, participants competed in the following competencies: Baking (BPP NC II), Food Services (FBS NC II), Information and Network Cabling (CSS NCII), Plumbing and Heating (Plumbing NC II), Welding(SMAW NC II), and Wiring Installation (EIM NC II). Moreover, it looked like a mini-reunion for the panel of judges, as some of them also trained in PPSAT for their NC II's and Training Methodology I.
